## **SUNDAY SERVICE 4-9-23**

## **REFLECTION QUESTIONS:**

- 1. Passover is the Jewish celebration of their release from slavery under the Egyptians. The 10th plague, death of the firstborn, was the trigger that brought about their release from captivity. Unless they had the blood of the Passover Lamb painted upon the door frames, the firstborn of that house would die. Discuss the symbolism of Passover from Exodus 11 and 12.
- 2. How would you define faith? What does it mean to have faith? Consider Hebrews 11:1 as a quide if you need some help.
- 3. Imagine holding your firstborn son/daughter or being a firstborn yourself on that night in Egypt long ago. What must the families of Israel have thought that night of Passover? How would the previous 9 plagues have strengthened their faith?
- 4. In light of the Passover celebration, why is Jesus our Passover Lamb?
- 5. Consider Hebrews 12:1-2 and discuss that Jesus went to the cross, "... for the joy that was set before him . . ." What does that mean to you?
